THE BASICS

What a Chapter Is

A BEAM chapter is a student-run business society inside your school. Students hold the leadership roles, run the events, and own the ventures.

Each chapter is self-governing, yet all chapters operate under BEAM’s shared mission and standards. Quality stays consistent across the network.

Membership is open to any student with a passion for business, regardless of background.

Each chapter will also send a monthly report to BEAM National; a document containing information including but not limited to progress updates, financial budgeting and data, challenges & risks, and next steps & priorities.

STRUCTURE

Chapter Leadership

01

President

Chapter Director. Oversees the chapter, monitors all five student-run businesses, and represents the school within BEAM Mongolia.

02

Vice President

Works directly under the President and prepares to assume leadership in later years — continuity by design.

03

Operations Lead

Maintains internal records, communication and organisational documents for the chapter.

04

Finance Director

Manages event finances, venture budgets and fundraising efforts.

The School Advisor, a faculty or staff member you designate, advises, guides and ensures compliance with school policy, but does not lead. Authority stays with the students; the advisor is the safeguard that keeps every activity aligned with institutional rules and values.

WHAT A CHAPTER DOES

Chapter Activities

Field trips

Visits to institutions relevant to business and finance for exposure beyond the classroom.

Case study & market sessions

The group examines a real company or recent market event and debates buy or sell. Interactive, and no prior experience required.

Drives & educational booths

Fundraisers for a good cause, such as supporting a struggling family business, for instance. This gives members ownership of a real project.

Peer-taught financial literacy

Members research budgeting, credit or compound interest, then teach it to the chapter or to younger students at the school.

Mini Shark Tank

Teams pitch a realistic, replicable business idea in front of their school, building the pitching skills national rounds demand.

Chapter awards

BEAM recognises outstanding chapters across many categories; friendly competition, and national recognition for your school's efforts.

FOR STUDENTS

What Students Gain

Real leadership, not a title

Officers run budgets, events and ventures are all experiences that reads honestly on a university application.

Scholarships & research

Top competitors are offered scholarship and research opportunities through our university partner.

Internships & work exposure

Opportunities to intern or work with leading businesses in Mongolia.

Certificates from UFE

Official recognition for lessons and competitions, taught by university lecturers.

Mentors and a network

Access to Mongolia's professional network, speakers from across industry, and peers at other schools.

Skills

Pitching, public speaking, financial literacy, teamwork under deadline. All skills are practiced.

FOR SCHOOLS

What Schools Gain

A chapter adds a full business and entrepreneurship programme to your school without adding a course or an additional expense.

Schools designate one advisor, and students do the rest. BEAM National supplies the curriculum, activities, competitions and partners.

A ready-made programme

Lessons, activity formats and competitions arrive designed and tested.

Light on staff

One advisor who monitors and guides: the students lead and administer.

National visibility

Your school is represented at BEAM events and eligible for chapter awards.

Institutional safeguards

Monthly reporting to BEAM National, and every activity checked against school policy.

Apply to found a chapter

Becoming an official BEAM chapter opens a direct pipeline to national conferences, connections, recognition, and work with leading businesses in Mongolia.

STEP 01

Name a faculty or staff member as School Advisor.

STEP 02

Gather 15 or more interested students and a founding officer team.

STEP 03

Send us your application and meet the BEAM National team.

STEP 04

Charter your chapter and start the first session.

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
